Desired results	By the end of the lesson, learners will be able to count in Arabic from one to twenty. They will also be able to ask and answer each other about age.
Assessment evidence	Students will be assessed according to their response when I ask them to count items in Arabic and when they do pairwork asking about age and through my monitoring, I can assess.
Learning Plan	After doing some activating exercise with music at the beginning of the lesson and revising some parts of the previous lesson, I will tell my students about the objectives of my lessons and when I start teaching numbers, I will use my gestures and fingers to present numbers in Arabic and then learners themselves will play the counting game in which I will start saying the name and he or she starts counting and then saying another name until all participates then I will divide them into groups to test their peers using cards and items after finishing that I will teach them how to ask and answer about age in Arabic by using some pictures and then I will make line up activity to practise speaking in pairs using the question “ How old are you?” and the next step is to divide them into three groups with wall charts and each group will write questions and answers about their age.
