Step 1—Desired Results

• Students will be able to identify the numbers in Arabic, count from 1 to 10 use the numbers to talk about things they have, their phone numbers, their age.

Step 2—Assessment Evidence

Performance task—What will students do to show what they have learned?

- Students will say the numbers from 1 to 10
- Students will answers questions of (how many......) using the numbers they learn in Arabic.
- Students will write the numbers from 1 to 10 in Arabic.
- Students will use the numbers in Arabic to talk about the things they have, their phone numbers and their age.

Step 3—Learning Plan

Learning activities - Answer's the question, how do I teach it?

- 1- Greet students using Arabic greeting.
- 2- students will be divided into teams each will take a number in Arabic , when this number is called the two players will race to the finish line and the first runner will add a point to their team .
- 3- Use cards to introduce the numbers from 1 to 10 in Arabic.
- 4- Students repeat in chorus and individually the numbers in Arabic.
- 5- Show the students the cards with numbers and they say the right number.
- 6- Students answer questions about how many? Using numbers from 1 to 10 in Arabic.
- 7- Give each student a card with a number, I say the number and the student who has the write card raise it.
- 8- Students count some objects and say the right number.
- 9- Students draw some objects according to the given numbers.
- 10- Students match some objects with the correct numbers.
- 11-put the cards of numbers on the floor and ask students whose names begin with the same letter to stand on a certain number.
- 12- students work in groups telling each other their phone numbers and their age in Arabic.

Students were very active and responsive. They enjoyed learning the numbers and they have fun playing the game with numbers.
